Each properly entered Jr. Market Beef Exhibitor will receive one (1) complementary 5-day Youth Pass

COMPETITION REQUIREMENTS: (subject to change without notice)

1. All entrants for livestock exhibited in market competitions shall provide a premises identification number at the time of entry. All market entries must have a **COOL** form attached to their entries.
2. All entrants must have read and be familiar with; the Colorado State Fair General Competition Requirements, General Livestock Competition Requirements, Junior Livestock Sale Participation Requirements and Health Requirements. Exhibitors must comply with the Wholesome Meat provisions.
3. Market Beef entered in the 2010 CSF must have been nose printed, county ear tagged and a CSF nomination card submitted as of April 1, 2010. If the animal was not previously nominated that Steer or Heifer is not eligible to show at the Colorado State Fair. If the original County ear tag is not properly intact on animal at the time of arrival, exhibitor must notify General Superintendent at check-in. Each exhibitor will be given the CSF ear tag at time of check-in.
4. There will be no outside bedding allowed on the State Fairgrounds. The Colorado State Fair Management is making it mandatory for all exhibitors to purchase their animal bedding through the Colorado State Fair Feed/Bedding Concessionaire. If you choose to violate this rule and bring your own bedding, you will be asked to remove it from the grounds immediately! This rule will be highly enforced by the Colorado State Fair Management team.
5. A photocopy of the official Brand Inspection must accompany all Market Steer and Heifer entries verifying junior exhibitor had proof of ownership prior to April 1, 2010. If there are no official brand papers at time of entry then a copy of the original Legal Bill of Sale must accompany entry that proves the ownership in the sole name of the junior exhibitor prior to April 1, 2010. All beef are required to have a brand inspection before entering the Colorado State Fair grounds. Refer to Health Requirements.

6.  Market animal exhibitors may enter as many animals as they have previously nominated, HOWEVER, only 4 animals are allowed to be shown in any Market division. Payment for only 4 animals must accompany entries. The exhibitor must notify the Colorado State Fair office which animals will not be shown by the cancellation date of Aug 18th. If the animals you are NOT showing are NOT cancelled by Aug 18th, the exhibitor will be charged the initial entry fee for those animals. No substitutions or late entries will be allowed upon arrival at the Colorado State Fair grounds.
7. All heifers must be accompanied by a certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian verifying the heifer is pregnancy tested OPEN within 30 days of Colorado State Fair.
8. No Steer or heifer born before January, 2009 is eligible to show. The dentition process may determine age. All animals must have both temporary central incisors (baby teeth) in place. Any evidence of tampering with tooth development will be cause for disqualification. The dentitions' decision is final.
9. Animals will be weighed at the designated scheduled time, all original brand inspection certificates and signed individual "Notice of USDA Wholesome Meat Act" card must be presented at this time. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have that Colorado State Fair ear tag in the animal's ear prior to official weigh-in. Any animal not tagged properly, or an exhibitor has incomplete paper work when reaching the scale he/she will be pulled from the line to complete such responsibilities and positioned at the end of the line.
10. Junior Market Beef Classes are open to steers and heifers. Steers must weigh a minimum of **1,000** pounds and heifers a minimum of **950** pounds at weigh-in to be eligible to compete in the market classes. If at the time of official weigh in, an animal fails to meet the minimum weight or exceeds maximum market show weight requirements "NO RE-WEIGH" will be offered. Those animals will be color marked as show disqualified, ineligible to show in showmanship and released to the exhibitor.
11. Steers and Heifers will be shown by weight. Steers and Heifers will be divided by sex into classes as determined appropriate by the Colorado State Fair Superintendents. Heifers will compete in a Heifer class. All first places in a class will compete as a Champion in the Grand Champion Drive. All remaining second placing will compete as a Reserve Champion in the Grand Champion Drive. There is no separate Grand Champion/Reserve Grand Champion Heifer. The Heifer will compete equally with the Steers in the Grand Champion drive.
12. The Colorado State Fair reserves the right to RE-WEIGH any/all Jr. Market Beef immediately following exhibition in the show ring and reserves the right to conduct random tests. Beef that deviate more than 5 percent (5%) from their official weight will be disqualified.
13. There will be an official lock down of the barns every night through sale day; with security in effect. All market Beef must be in the barn for lock down. No over night tie outs will be allowed.

14. Any violation of the following Competition Requirements will automatically result in disqualification with no recourse:
 - (a) The natural color of the Steer/Heifer cannot be altered using any artificial coloring. However, products that match the Steer/Heifer natural color may be used in the fitting process from the knees and hocks down and on the switch only. (For example, black products may be used on black-legged Steer/Heifer, red on a red-legged Steer/Heifer, and white on a white-legged Steer/Heifer)
 - (b) Any grooming material on any other part of the body not mentioned, will be rubbed with a cloth or glove which will show evidence of artificial color,
 - (c) Any entries adding an artificial tail head or tail fin, artificial poll, or any hair or hair-like substance.
 - (d) The showing of livestock of any ineligible age or showing unethically fitted livestock is prohibited.
 - (e) Unethical fitting will be deemed to consist of any method, which alters the natural conformation of any part of the animal's body.
 - (f) Any ear tag tampering or removals, other than by a Colorado State Fair official or licensed veterinarian.
15. A water container, with water, must be visible and available for watering on a regular basis in each penned/stalled area at all times. **NO** feeding or watering of livestock in show rings, holding pens or to and from re-weigh stations will be permitted. Colorado State Fair Officials reserve the right, at its discretion to contact a CSF veterinarian to determine if water should be given.
16. Exhibitors only are allowed in the beef show ring staging areas.
17.  If an exhibitor would happen to have all four (4) of their animals in the same weight class all premiums will be paid to that exhibitor.
18. Placement ribbons will be presented to 1st thru 6th placing in each class.
19. This show is a terminal show only for the Jr. Market Beef that are selected for the Junior Livestock Sale. Animals not selected for the Junior Sale will be released to the exhibitor. There is no buy-back consignment offered through the Colorado State Fair. Market Beef that do not make sale will be released to the exhibitor after the final sale order is posted. Trucking and handling fees will be deducted from proceeds on sale animals only. Refer to Junior Livestock Competition Requirements (Market Animal disposition)
20. All exhibitors are responsible for the care of their own animals until animal has been released or animal has sold at the Junior Livestock sale.
21. If exhibitor makes sale, exhibitor and his/her family must be familiar and comply with all Junior Livestock Sale Participation Requirements.

- 4. The Judge will consider appearance of the animal, showmanship ability of the exhibitor and the exhibitor's appearance, courtesy and knowledge.
