LIMITED TO FOUR (4) HOGS PER EXHIBITOR

Each properly entered Jr. Market Animal Exhibitor shall receive one (1) complimentary 5-day Youth Pass.

COMPETITION REQUIREMENTS: (subject to change without notice)

1. All entrants for livestock exhibited in open, breed, or market competitions shall provide a premises identification number at the time of entry. All market entries must have a COOL form attached to their entries.
2. All entrants must have read and be familiar with the Requirements, General Livestock Competition Requirements, Junior Livestock Sale Participation Requirements and Health Requirements. Exhibitors must comply with the Wholesome Meat provisions.
3. There will be no outside bedding allowed on the State Fairgrounds. The Colorado State Fair Management is making it mandatory for all exhibitors to purchase their animal bedding through the Colorado State Fair Feed/Bedding Concessionaire. If you choose to violate this rule and bring your own bedding, you will be asked to remove it from the grounds immediately! This rule will be highly enforced by the Colorado State Fair Management team.
4. Jr. Market Hogs entered in the 2010 Colorado State Fair must have been ear notched, county tagged and a CSF nomination card received in the Colorado State Fair Livestock office as of June 1, 2010. If the Hog was not previously nominated that Market Hog is not eligible to show at the 2010 Colorado State Fair.
5.  Market animal exhibitors may enter as many animals as they have previously nominated, HOWEVER, only 4 animals are allowed to be shown in any Market division. Payment for only 4 animals must accompany entries. The exhibitor must notify the Colorado State Fair office which animals will not be shown by the cancellation date of Aug 18th. If the animals you are NOT showing are NOT cancelled by Aug 18th, the exhibitor will be charged the initial entry fee for those animals. No substitutions or late entries will be allowed upon arrival at the Colorado State Fair grounds.

6. Each Colorado State Fair market hog exhibitor must have passed and obtained a **PQA-PLUS** youth certificate through their county. Every Market Hog exhibitor must attach a copy of their PQA-PLUS to their Colorado State Fair entry form. The Colorado State Fair Market hog show is terminal; therefore all Market Hog exhibitors must fill out a **COOL Form, Tyson Fair Swine Affidavit**. All forms are available on our Colorado State Fair website under forms or by request from the Colorado State Fair livestock office. All participants must adhere to the fair swine affidavit (as prepared by the National Pork Board) and supply the signed form to the fair representatives. This form will accompany the animal named at the time of transportation to the slaughter facility.
7. Classes should be entered by breed classification only. Market classes will be offered in the breed divisions listed; with the order of show from lightweight through heavyweight divisions. Classifying will be done by a 3 person classification system.
8. Each individual exhibitor will be permitted to enter only four (4) Hogs in the Market Hog show. If an exhibitor brings 1 or 2 pigs they are allowed only one pen, 3 to 4 pigs are allowed 2 pens. Standard pen size is approximately 6' X 6'. Members of a family will be required to group 2 hogs together. If dividers are required within a pen, it is up to the exhibitor to provide their own, adjustable panel. No tack pens will be available until all Hogs have been stalled. Any items such as feed, show boxes, etc. placed in pens not assigned to the exhibitor will be removed without warning. Check with Superintendent for availability of space for tack placement. If stalling capacities are reached, entries will be returned to exhibitor.
9. Pseudorabies test requirements:
 - (A) A pig must originate from Colorado or a Pseudorabies "Free" Status State when purchased for feeding, and the exhibitor must provide evidence (bill of sale) of the pig's origin prior to unloading at the State Fair.
 - (B) Arrive at the fair with a current health certificate.
 - (C) If conditions A & B above are met a Pseudorabies test is not required.
 - (D) If condition A is not met the pigs must be tested and negative to Pseudorabies prior to entry into the State Fair.
 - (E) All 4-H and FFA hog exhibitors must have a **Youth Pork Quality- PLUS Certification**.
10. Market Barrows and Gilts are eligible and may be purebred, grade or crossbreeds farrowed current year and must weigh not less than **230** pounds and not more than **280** pounds to be eligible to show. If at the time of official weigh in, an animal fails to meet the minimum weight or exceeds maximum market show weight requirements "NO RE-WEIGH" will be offered. If a hog does not make weight it will be marked for packers only and that hog can not be used for showmanship competition.
11. Do not remove any county ear tags. If the original County ear tag is not properly intact on animal at the time of arrival, exhibitor must notify Livestock Superintendent before unloading the animal. A Colorado State Fair ear tag will be given to the exhibitor at the time of check in. The youth exhibitor in charge of entered animal will tag hogs with the official CSF ear tags that matches the exhibitor's back number for that animal. No animal will be re-tagged during weigh-in. NO Exceptions.

12. All hogs must be ear notched and meet the specific breed ear notching system to be eligible to show in their breed classifications. All Hogs must have at least one notch in each ear. Notches must be completely healed by show date. For all breed entries refer to classification guidelines.
13. Clipping of hogs with power clippers is prohibited on the fairgrounds. No hoof treatments are allowed in the Market Hog division. Hogs must have been washed with soap and water only and clean for weigh-in.
14. Individual "Notice of USDA Wholesome Meat Act" cards for market hogs will be provided to each exhibitor for each animal entered in the Colorado State Fair, on the day of the weigh-in. These cards must be presented to the Superintendent during weigh-in. Animals will not be weighed without a signed identification card. Any animal not tagged properly, or any exhibitor who has incomplete paper work when reaching the scale will be pulled from the line to complete such responsibilities and positioned at the end of the line. NO EXCEPTIONS!
15. Show management or its authorized agent reserves the right to re-classify hogs at weigh-in which are deemed improperly entered in any breed division. Refer to classification guide. The classifier's decision shall be final.
16. Market Hogs will be weighed and divided into as near equal classes as feasible by breed. There must be 15 or more in a breed division to establish individual breed classes. With less than 15 in a breed division, breeds will be combined and shown in the other purebred (OPB) division. There will be one OPB division, regardless of numbers, with one Jr. Livestock Sale spot guaranteed. If at least three percent of total show is OPBs, a second sale slot will be awarded. Beyond that, sale spots will be designated by the show's administration.
17. The Colorado State Fair reserves the right to RE-WEIGH any and all Jr. Market Hogs immediately following exhibition in the show ring and reserves the right to conduct random tests. Hogs that deviate more than 5 percent (5%) from their official weight will be disqualified.
18. Hogs must be shown without hairdressing compounds including, oils, paints, powders, artificial coloring or other dressing to include Hoof ointments or treatment paints. Violation will result in automatic disqualification.
19. Exhibitors only are allowed in the hog holding or staging pens at any time.
20. A water container, with water, must be visible and available for watering on a regular basis in each penned/stalled area at all times. Colorado State Fair Officials reserve the right, at its discretion to contact a CSF veterinarian to determine if water should be given. Absolutely; no feeding or watering of livestock in show rings, holding pens or to and from re-weighs stations.
21.  If an exhibitor would happen to have all four (4) of their animals in the same weight class all premiums will be paid to that exhibitor.

22. Show ring placings will be to 10th placing only. All other exhibitors will be excused from the show ring before the judge announces the top 10 places for that class. Premiums will be paid thru 10th place in classes consisting of 15 head or more. Ribbons will be presented 1st thru 6th placings.

23. This show is a **terminal show** for market hog entries. Market Hogs not selected for the Junior Livestock Sale will be automatically consigned to the packing plant. (see packing plant form requirement above #6.) A trucking and handling fee will be deducted from proceeds. Refer to Junior Livestock Competition Requirements.

24. If exhibitor makes sale, that exhibitor and his/her family must be familiar and comply with all Junior Livestock Sale Participation Requirements.

COMPETITION REQUIREMENTS:

1. No Pre-entry or Entry Fee required.
2. Classes are limited to exhibitors with Jr. Market Swine Show entries. Exhibitors must show their own animal. Any animal marked as light or heavy can not be used for Showmanship competition.
3. Three age divisions are offered with exhibitor age considered as of January 1, of the current year.
4. The Judge will consider appearance of the animal, showmanship ability of the exhibitor and the exhibitor's appearance, courtesy and knowledge.
5. Rosettes 1st through 6th by the Colorado State Fair.

THE NATIONAL SWINE REGISTRY, PO Box 2417, West Lafayette, IN 47996-2417, is a consolidation of the American YORKSHIRE Club, American LANDRACE Association, HAMPSHIRE Swine Registry, and UNITED DUROC Swine Registry. Offers \$100.00 to the owner of the Grand Champion Barrow overall breeds in the on-foot show provided the barrow is a registered DUROC, HAMPSHIRE, LANDRACE, or YORKSHIRE and is from a recorded litter. The owner must provide proof of registration and a picture to receive their award.

THE NATIONAL SWINE REGISTRY offers \$100.00 to the owner of the Grand Champion Carcass overall breeds provided the carcass is a registered DUROC, HAMPSHIRE, LANDRACE, or YORKSHIRE. The owner must show proof of a matching ear notch with a registration paper to receive the award. All award winners must submit proof of registry and supply appropriate picture to the NATIONAL SWINE REGISTRY within 60 days of the show to receive their award.

THE AMERICAN BERKSHIRE ASSOCIATION, Box 2436, West Lafayette, IN 47996-2436, offers a Plaque to the Grand Champion Junior Market Hog if the winning entry is a purebred Berkshire out of a recorded litter. A photo, name and number of sire and dam and brief story of the winning entry is to be sent to the association within 30 days following the show. All Berkshire swine must be registered by the American Berkshire association(ABA), PO

Box 2436, 1769 US 52 West, West Lafayette, IN 47996. Said registration paper must be presented at the time of check in. The ABA is the only Berkshire swine registry recognized by the National Association of Swine Records (NASR) and the National Pedigreed Livestock Council (NPLC).

SWINE SHOW CLASSIFICATION STANDARDS

Updated by the National Swine Registry March, 2009

NOTE: *All Breeds must have been ear notched within seven days of birth. Any hog not properly ear-notched or ear-notch not healed completely will be ineligible for show. All 4-H and FFA hog exhibitors must have a Youth Pork Quality- PLUS Certification.*

BERKSHIRE:

1. A black and white animal with erect ears exhibiting Berkshire character.
2. A Berkshire must have the white on all four legs, face and tail (unless tail is docked). One of the leg points may also be missing.
3. A Berkshire must NOT have a solid black nose (rim of nose).
4. A Berkshire must NOT have a solid white or a solid black face from the ears forward.
5. White is allowed on the ears, but NO solid white may appear on the ears.
6. Occasional splash of white may appear on the body.

CHESTER WHITE:

1. Must possess Chester White Breed Character.
2. Must be solid white in color, no color on the skin larger than a silver dollar, no colored hair.
3. Ears must be down and medium size.
4. Any signs of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such ear tags are determined to be not permissible and are grounds for disqualification.

DUROC:

1. Must be red in color and possess Duroc Breed Character, (ears must be down and medium size).
2. Must NOT have any white hair located on the animal.
3. Must NOT have any black hair.
4. Must NOT have more than three black spots on the skin and none of these spots can be larger than two inches in diameter.
5. Must NOT have any shading or indication of a belt.

HAMPSHIRE:

1. Must be Black in color with a white belt starting on a front leg. Belt may partially or totally encircle body.
2. Must possess Hampshire Breed character. (ears must be erect and not rounded).
3. Must NOT have any white hair or indication of streaking on the forehead.
4. Must NOT have any red hair.

LANDRACE:

1. Must be white in color and possess Landrace Breed character.
2. Must NOT allow any color hair other than white.
3. Must NOT allow more than three spots of skin pigmentation, exceeding the size of one United States minted quarter currency.
4. Ears must be down.

POLAND CHINA:

1. Must possess Poland China Breed character.
2. Must be black with six white points (face, feet and tail) with an occasional splash of white on the body. A hog may not possess more than one black leg and be determined as a Poland China. (Tail docking is permissible eliminating that white point.)
3. Must have ears down.
4. Must NOT have evidence of belt formation.
5. Can NOT have any red or sandy hair and/or pigment.
6. Hogs that have weighted ear tags or evidence of tampering with possible ear tags are ineligible.

SPOTTED SWINE:

1. Must be black and white in color.
2. Must possess Spotted Breed character.
3. Ears must be down and reasonably sized.
4. Any red tinted or sandy brown spots are ineligible.
5. NO solid black head from ears forward.
6. NO distinct white belt pattern (hair or skin) encircling and extending down and onto each shoulder.

YORKSHIRE:

1. Must be white in color and possess Yorkshire Breed character (ears must be erect)
2. Must NOT have any colored hair other than white.
3. Must NOT have colored skin pigmentation larger than a silver dollar.
4. Must NOT have masking above the eyes larger than a silver dollar.
