- 1. PREMISES IDENTIFICATION:** All entrants for livestock exhibited in open, breed, or market competitions shall provide a premises registration number, Pursuant to 8 CCR 1208-1 8.4(a)(i).
- 2. COMPLIANCE:** In order to comply with the State of Colorado and the Internal Revenue Service, a properly completed IRS form W-9 must be submitted with each competitive entry listing the exhibitor's social security number. When completing the IRS Form W-9 that is included in this entry information, please be sure to carefully read and follow the instructions on the form. No entries will be processed without a completed IRS Form W-9. No premium monies won at the Colorado State Fair will be paid if the IRS Form W-9 form is incorrect.
- 3. FEED AND BEDDING:** There will be no outside bedding allowed on the State Fairgrounds. The Colorado State Fair Management is making it mandatory for all exhibitors to purchase their animal bedding through the Colorado State Fair Feed/Bedding Concessionaire. If you choose to violate this Competition Requirement and bring your own bedding, you will be asked to remove it from the grounds immediately! This Competition Requirement will be highly enforced by the Colorado State Fair Management team.
- 4. COOPERATION:** All exhibitors and their associates are asked to cooperate with all Colorado State Fair officials including office clerks, ground admission, security and parking personnel in all matters of policy. Colorado State Fair General Competition Requirements, Livestock General Competition Requirements, Junior Livestock Competition Requirements and National Show Ring Code of Ethics will govern.

5. **ENTRY FORMS:** Enter on current official Colorado State Fair entry forms only. See individual departments for the proper entry form. All entry forms can be downloaded from the website: www.coloradostatefair.com Click on Exhibit Competition then Livestock shows then Premium Book scroll down to your selected breed section or to the Form section. You can also order entry forms and summary sheets from the Colorado State Fair Livestock Department, 719-404-2026 or 2027. When requesting entry forms please specify breed and division.
6. **ENTRIES:** Exhibitors are not limited to the number of entries in any one class (except in Market Classes, See Junior Livestock Competition Requirements). All exhibitors are required to purchase an exhibitors pass. For an acceptable Livestock entry the following forms are required: **W-9 Form** with exhibitor's **Social Security number and signature**, one (1) completed **Exhibitor' entry summary sheet** for each exhibitor, one (1) completed **entry form** for each animal entry, completed **IAFE** form per exhibitor. All Market entries must have a completed **Packers Certificate and COOL form** (1 for each market animal) **with a special Tyson, form for market hogs (refer to the market hog section)** and **payment** in full. Major credit cards are accepted. Check your individual division for any special additional documents your division requires such as copies of **Registration Papers, Brand Inspection Papers**, or a **Bill of Sale**. Pursuant to 8 CCR 1208-1 8.4(a)(i), all entrants for livestock exhibited in open, breed, or market competitions shall provide a **premises identification number**. Without any of the above-mentioned information and forms your entry will be considered incomplete until are required information is complete. Receipt of entries made by exhibitors in the Livestock office of the Colorado State Fair will be deemed as exhibitor acceptance of all Colorado State Fair Competition Requirements. See the Livestock Entry Check List on the website for the required department entry forms.

7. **HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:** All exhibitors must comply with the respective Livestock Health Requirements (see Livestock Health Requirements and Regulations Section). All livestock will be carefully examined at the arrival gate for evidence of infectious or contagious diseases and if such is found, they will be removed from the grounds and held in quarantine and treated at the owner's expense. Diseased or injured animals may be removed from the grounds upon recommendation of attending veterinarian and release signed by the Livestock Department Supervisor and General Livestock Superintendent. Animals deemed unworthy of competition by the Official Superintendent will be barred from competition and removed from the fairgrounds. In such case, entry fees will be forfeited. Refer to Health Requirements for complete information and health inspection requirements. Diseased Animals showing signs and symptoms of disease cannot enter the Livestock Show area or grounds. Superintendents and Veterinarians will refuse unloading privileges to animals.

- 8. ELIGIBILITY:** Open Division eligibility requires all animals to be registered in their respective Breed Association and be owned continuously in the exhibitors name or Ranch / Farm name since **July 20**, of the current year. *Individual-owned animals cannot be combined with a Ranch/Farm name for accumulating points toward Premier Breeder/Premier Exhibitor awards.* A copy of the registration papers and transfers must accompany entry. Original registration papers and transfers must be available for inspection and comparison with the animal at show time. All Breed division special Competition Requirements must be met. Exhibitors entered in the Junior Breeding show may enter the corresponding Open classes upon meeting all requirements and making proper entry and payment by the August entry deadline.
- 9. CHECK IN PROCEDURE:** All Livestock Exhibitors must enter through Gate #4, by presenting their acknowledgement card and proceeding to their load out area and then report to the Livestock Office. Exhibitors must have all necessary paperwork to complete check-in in a timely manner. Entries changes must be made final 12 hours prior to show time. See individual division for other specifics. Each exhibitor will be required to review entry information and credentials, and the exhibitors signature will constitute exhibitor's acceptance of entries as recorded in secretary's record, and agrees he/she has observed and will abide by all Competition Requirements and regulations constituted by the Colorado State Fair. Anyone signing for the exhibitor will take full responsibility and liability for named exhibitor.
- 10. LATE ENTRIES:** Those exhibitors who have met the posted 2010 entry deadlines will be allowed to submit late entries for 2010 with a \$5.00 late fee plus the regular class entry fee, (pending available space). Anyone wanting to make a new entry after the posted deadline dates will be allowed to do so with a double entry fee and at the discretion of management, pending available space and after all other requirements have been met.
- 11. SUBSTITUTIONS:** Open Breeding substitutions within the same age, class and owner will be accepted in the livestock office up to 24 hours prior to respective show. Substitutions not officially recorded in this manner for secretary's books are invalid. Only one substitution for the original animal will be allowed. There will be no substitutions allowed for different age classifications or owners. Substitutions will not be permitted once check-in is completed. No exceptions. This Competition Requirement pertain to all species. See respective individual division.
- 12. CLASSES DESCRIPTIONS:** Classes with one or two animals making an entry; (Cow/Calf, Dam/Daughter, Produce of Dam and Pair Classes) are considered individual classes and require pre-entry and payment of the regular entry fee. Classes with three or more animals making up an entry are considered group classes. Group Classes require pre-entry by a single identifying exhibitor with no entry fee. There are no group classes offered in Open Breeding Cattle and Open / Jr. Dairy divisions. All animals shown in group or herd classes must have been entered and shown in their respective individual age class. No nurse cows or nurse goats are allowed on grounds.

13. GENERATORS / FANS / BLOCKING CHUTES / TRIM CHUTES / TRIM TABLES &

PORTABLE SCALES: There will be a \$25.00 charge for ALL generators payable on your summary sheet or added on at the time of check-in. Generators must be approved by a CSF Livestock superintendent. A permit tag will be assigned after payment is made. Any generator not having a CSF permit will be removed from the premises and exhibitor will be subject to disqualification. Fans, blocking chutes, generators, trimming chutes and trim tables are restricted to the individual exhibitor's assigned stalling area not to interfere with any other exhibitors' stalling area or aisle ways, (please observe all NO GENERATOR signage) otherwise, an alternate location will be designated by the CSF management. Free standing fans will not be allowed. Hanging fans will only be allowed when attached to the tie rails or to supports attached to the tie rails. No fans will be allowed to blow from behind an animal regardless of attachment or location. All fans must be hung above stalling area. All extension cords must be UL approved minimum 16.3. Over sized and refrigerated free-standing fans will not be allowed. The Colorado State fair superintendents have the authority to disallow any unethical equipment. Anyone violating the set up of fans, blocking chutes, generators, trimming chutes and trim tables are subject to a \$50.00 fine and / or immediate disqualification. No outside scales will be allowed in the Market Lamb, Hog or Goat barns. Those scales will be provided by the Colorado State Fair. Market Beef and Open Beef will be limited to blocking chutes scales only.

14. STALLS, TACK STALLS, PENS AND TIE OUTS:

All tack stalls requests must be submitted in writing and received in the Livestock Office no later than entry deadline date. There is no guarantee the request can or will be honored. The Colorado State Fair superintendents will allocate stall space within the barns at the time entry fees are completely paid. Participants will only receive one (1) stall for every animal delivered to the Colorado State Fair regardless of the number of entries made for the show. A cow-calf pair is considered as one (1) entry. A limited number of tie-out stalls are available and will be available on a first come first serve basis. Tampering with other exhibitors stall, pen assignments and/or tie-outs will not be tolerated, resulting in immediate disqualification and immediate removal from the premises. Straw bedding purchased from the Colorado State Fair Feed and Bedding Concessionaire may be used in the cattle tie-out areas. All stalls and tie-outs must be cleaned daily before 10:00 a.m. The Colorado State Fair is not responsible for any animals in the tie-out area any time day or night.

15. CANCELLATIONS / REFUNDS:

All cancellations must be submitted (telephone, email or mail) no later than Wednesday August 18th. No entry fee refunds will be given for any cancellations made at time of check in. Entry fee refunds may be allowed in the case of a personal emergency for which an official letterhead statement from the licensed practitioner must be submitted or in case of a death in the family, the article from the funeral home must be submitted and in the case of animal sickness a Veterinarian letterhead release is required. All letters must be submitted to the Colorado State Fair Livestock Manager to obtain any type of entry refund. **Parking passes, exhibitor passes and processing fees are not refundable.**

- 16. SHOW BACK NUMBERS:** Each animal entered is assigned a Colorado State Fair number. Those numbers will be given to each exhibitor as a back number at the time of check-in. Every back number has the animals name and class(s) entered written on the back. It is the exhibitors' responsibility to have the correct back number displayed on their back or in a holder attached to the waist before entering the show ring. Not having the correct show animal number displayed coinciding with the original entry on the official judges sheets may result in disqualification of that animal. Special event hip tag numbers must be displayed on the animals' hip when exhibitor/animal is in the show ring.
- 17. UNETHICALLY FITTED LIVESTOCK:** The following are termed unethical practices: doctoring, doping, tubing or injecting show animals for body "fill-ins" or the alteration, changing, defacing or any modification of the markings of show animals and the anatomical structure of an animal, the removal, alteration, changing or purposely damaging ear tags; any type of injection where oils, glycerin or like substances are used for body "fill-in", external applications of such things as liniments and blistering agents that would cause an edematous condition; use of ice packs or other refrigerants to alter the quality of the finish of an animal. Icing of animals will not be allowed. No drench guns or artificial devise for hydrating or feeding of animals will be allowed. Drenching process will be allowed only by the Colorado State Fair on call veterinarian. No animal shall be decorated with any unnecessary paraphernalia during judging. Changing the color of hair at any point, spot or area on the animals' body or any grooming material that allows color to be rubbed off from any animal will result in disqualification. No altering structure of hair or wool coat except for trimming and blocking will be allowed. No clipping or hoof treatments of Market Hogs will be allowed. Clipping of market hogs with power clippers is prohibited on the fairgrounds. Any entry adding an artificial tail head or tail fin, artificial poll, or adding any hair or hair-like substance will be disqualified. (Open Breed Association Rules supersede). The showing of livestock of any ineligible age or showing of unethically fitted livestock is prohibited. Any exhibitor not complying with any of the above listed unethical practices, or any other practice deemed unethical by the Colorado State Fair Management will forfeit all premium monies and the owner of the animal will be barred from future participation until such time a reinstatement is made by the Fair Management. Refer to individual divisions.
- 18. WATER:** A water container, with water, must be visible and available for watering on a regular basis in each penned/stalled area at all times. NO feeding or watering of livestock in show rings, holding pens or to and from re-weigh stations will be permitted. Colorado State Fair Officials reserve the right, at its discretion to contact a CSF veterinarian to determine if water should be given.
- 19. SHOW RING:** Exhibitors must exhibit and parade their animals in the show ring as directed by the CSF superintendent. No muzzles or nose rings will be permitted on any show animal at any time. See individual breeds for nose ring requirements. The superintendent shall exclude stock from competition for unnecessary or upsetting delay on the part of the exhibitors in bringing animals into the show rings. Violation of the superintendents or ring steward show ring procedures will result in immediate dismissal from the class and disqualification.

- 20. PREMIUMS:** There is no limit to the number of animals an exhibitor may enter in a show or in any one class (WITH THE EXCEPTION OF MARKET CLASSES). There is no restriction as to how many places one exhibitor can be paid per class. Premiums will be paid in accordance with the premium schedule listed in each division. Available show premiums are listed under each individual division. Champion Classes consist only of those animals that have been awarded first place. Reserve Champion classes consist of the remaining first place animals and the second place animal from the class from which the Champion was selected. Ribbons will be awarded through 6th place in all classes. Rosettes will be awarded for champion classes. See individual breeds for special awards. There are no premiums paid for Champion Challenge Classes.
- 21. ERRONEOUS ENTRY:** Participants are responsible for their own errors, and those of their agents and representatives, in preparation of entries. Entry forms must be completely filled out in accordance with instructions and signed by appropriate parties. By submitting application for entry, participant acknowledges they have read the Colorado State Fair Show agreements of the Colorado State Fair General Competition Requirements; Open and Junior Livestock Show Competition Requirements; Junior Livestock Sale Competition Requirements; specific and/or special division Competition Requirements and regulations; The National Show Ring Code of Ethics and the USDA Wholesome Meat Act, and agree to observe and abide by these Competition Requirements and regulations.
- 22. OBJECTIONABLE EXHIBITS:** The Colorado State Fair management reserves the right to exclude from the grounds any exhibit, animal, or entry that may be falsely entered and also reserves the right to exclude those deemed undesirable or objectionable without assigning a reason therefore. Person or persons who shall violate any of the Competition Requirements herein will forfeit all pre-paid fees and any premiums won at the Colorado State Fair. The management reserves the right to decline acceptance of entries at any time without statement of reason.
- 23. PARKING:** Official parking permits ONLY are allowed on grounds. Those who violate any parking restrictions are subject to disqualification. Only 30 minute loading and unloading will be allowed inside Gate #4 barn areas. All vehicle parking credentials are for outside of Gate #4. Overflow parking will be in the South Lot. Otherwise parking with a fee in public lots will apply. Large trucks and all livestock trailers must park in the secured designated area at Greyhound Park. Vehicles parked in unauthorized areas without designated parking passes will be towed at owner's expense. Anyone refusing to move their vehicle out of the loading area upon request by officials will automatically be towed at the owner's expense and at that time the offending individual, their animals and tack will be removed from the premises by Colorado State Fair Public Safety Officer. All pre-paid entry / credentials fees and any premiums won at the Colorado State Fair will be forfeited.
- 24. SCHEDULE OF EVENTS:** Colorado State Fair officials reserve the right to cancel events, change scheduling, combine, split classes, cancel classes, and adjust premiums if deemed necessary. Officials have the right to combine any classes with five (5) or fewer animals entered at the time of show.

- 25. INTERPRETATION AND/ OR ADMINISTRATION OF COMPETITION REQUIREMENTS AND REGULATIONS:** The Colorado State Fair reserves to itself the final and absolute right to interpret these Competition Requirements and Regulations, to fairly and impartially settle, determine all matters, questions and differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incident to the Show, and the right to amend or add to these Competition Requirements and Regulations as its judgments may determine. The Colorado State Fair reserves the right to cancel events or change scheduling if deemed necessary. See each division for any specific or special Competition Requirements.
- 26. INTERFERENCE:** No person shall act as a judge in any department in which he may have any interest with an exhibitor, agent or employee of an exhibitor, and if such case shall be presented, the Department Supervisor may remove such judge, and substitute another judge temporarily. Judges, Wholesome Meat Act, IAFE Code of Ethics rules and a current membership list of NALSRMA are available upon request in the Colorado State Fair Livestock Office and the Colorado State Fair manager's office.
- 27. RETURNED CHECKS:** Any exhibitor issuing a check for payment, which is returned as non-sufficient funds or for any other reason for not clearing their account, will be charged a \$30.00 service charge. The exhibitor will have 5 working days within which to make payment, by cash or money order, in the amount of the check plus the service charge. No exhibitor will be permitted to show until the non-sufficient check has been paid. If any check is returned after exhibitor has shown, all premiums will be held until the amount of the check is paid, including the \$30.00 service charge by cash or money order. Those who do not reinstate their check within 60 days will be turned over to the State of Colorado Collection Department.
- 28. BARRED EXHIBITORS:** The Colorado State Fair and the Colorado State Fair Board, in cooperation with, and as a member of the North American Livestock Show and Rodeo Managers Association and Competition Requirement infraction database, reserves the right to refuse entry of any exhibitor who has been barred from any other show on the basis of unethical practices, disqualified from competition at any major livestock show, from any state fair or county fair or has had premiums withheld or withdrawn on the grounds of Competition Requirement.
- 29. PREMIUM CHECKS / REFUNDS:** Premium checks and Sale checks will be issued only to the individual exhibitor whose name and social security number has been accepted through the State of Colorado as it appears on the completed IRS form W-9 and summary packet. Checks will not be issued to an exhibitor's relative, company, or fitter. In case of a lost check please notify the Colorado State Fair office immediately.
ALL PREMIUM CHECKS MUST BE CASHED BY DECEMBER 31, 2010. NO PREMIUM OR SALE CHECK WILL BE REISSUED AFTER DECEMBER 31, 2010.
- 30. USING ANIMALS IN JUDGING CONTESTS:** When an exhibitor is called upon to furnish one or more animals for the students to judge in the Dairy or Livestock Judging Contests, he/she is expected to do so. Refusing an animal to be used in this manner will result in the forfeit of any prizes he/she has won and banned from further participation in the show.

31. EXHIBITOR LIABILITY: Exhibitors of livestock must exercise due discretion in regard to the animals they are exhibiting, whether in the ring, stall or pen and exhibitor must assume all responsibility for any damages caused by or to their animals. The exhibitor will be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to, or occasioned by, or arising from, any animal or article exhibited by him/her and for its description as given in the catalog. He/she shall indemnify Colorado State Fair against all legal or other proceedings in regard there to, as well as any damage or injury to any other person or property, caused by the exhibitor or any of the animals exhibited with such exhibition or any of the animals so exhibited.

32. MOTORIZED UTILITY VEHICLES: NO motorized utility vehicle resembling any high-powered motorized sports vehicles are allowed on the Colorado State Fair Grounds. Golf carts will only be allowed on the Colorado State Fair premises if issued by the management of the Colorado State Fair. Any privately owned type of Golf cart must be inspected and pre-approved by Colorado State Fair Security; the owner must obtain a permit for use and must provide proof of liability insurance. The owner and driver of the vehicle must have a valid driver's license. Any person driving a Colorado State Fair issued golf cart must be a Fair time contracted employee and have a current driver's license. ALL COLORADO STATE FAIR CARTS MUST RESIDE ON THE COLORADO STATE FAIR PREMISES. CARTS MUST REMAIN IN THE ISSUED DEPARTMENT AREA AT NIGHT. ANYONE REFUSING TO ABIDE BY THIS RULE WILL BE SUBJECT TO DISCIPLINARY ACTION.

33. REPORTING ALLEGATIONS OF WRONGDOING: Whenever any person believes that an exhibitor has engaged in any activity that violates the competition requirements of the Colorado State Fair or engaged in any unethical activity during the course of a competition, such person shall have the opportunity to provide his or her allegations of wrong-doing to the Colorado State Fair for review. Any such report shall be made on a form provided by the Colorado State Fair and in the following manner:

- a) All forms must be signed by three individuals, each of whom must be able to allege with particularity the facts upon which the allegation is based and each of whom must be able to attest to his or her personal knowledge of the event.
- b) A one-time, non-refundable administrative fee of \$300 shall accompany any form submitted for review.
- c) All forms shall be submitted directly to the General Manager's Office promptly, but no more than 24 hours, after the alleged incident occurs.
- d) Colorado State Fair management shall submit the form and supporting documents or evidence to a neutral panel for review.
- e) The neutral panel shall consist of the following persons, or their designees: 1) the Colorado State Veterinarian; 2) a senior employee of the Colorado State Fair; 3) a commissioner of the Colorado State Fair Authority Board of Commissioners; and 4) the Pueblo County District Attorney. (continued next page)
- f) The panel shall review the form, the allegations, and the supporting evidence and report its findings and proposed decision to the General Manager for determination and final enforcement.
- g) At no time will any exhibition, judging event, or other on-going event be delayed, stopped, or interrupted as a result of any allegation of wrong-doing so reported under this paragraph.
- h) Any decision that the General Manager renders based upon the review and proposed decision of the neutral panel shall be deemed a final decision exercised in his or her official capacity of General Manager and shall be enforced consistent with the requirements of competition as set forth in this Premium Book and as enforced by 8 CCR 1208-1, the Colorado State Fair Authority Rules.

- 34. CLEAN UP:** All stalls and alleys must be cleaned daily before 8:30 am. Dirty shavings and manure must be piled in the designated area of the barn. NO manure should be put into trash cans.

Those found dumping manure or trash in undesignated areas will be subject to a fine of \$100.00 and/or disqualification, determined by the Colorado State Fair officials.

- 35. RELEASE OF ANIMALS:** Participants must obtain a release form from the General Livestock Superintendent for release of all their animals, equipment, tack and feed or bedding before leaving grounds. Your vehicle and trailers will be checked and the release will be collected at the exit gate. Removal of animals from the Colorado State Fairgrounds without a signed release and/or prior to scheduled release time, will result in the loss of premiums and be subject to any penalties the Colorado State Fair may order and/or penalties prescribed by law.
- 36. DOGS OR SERVICE ANIMALS:** No dogs are allowed in the Livestock area of the Colorado State Fairgrounds other than those used as service animals. **NO** Exceptions. All 4-H competition dogs must stay in their designated show area only and are not allowed in the Livestock, Sheep/Swine, Goat or Small Animal barns or areas.
- 37. REQUESTING OF NEW BREED SHOW AND INFRACTIONS OF EXISTING:** The Colorado State Fair Management will consider requests for new breed shows with a signed request by five potential exhibitors and a payment of \$500.00 which will be applied toward the shows premiums presented to the Livestock manager before February 1, of the year the breed would like to participate. Breed shows that decrease to less than 10 exhibitors will be placed on a one-year probation period, pending animal numbers for the upcoming year will determine Colorado State Fair's right to discontinue that Associations show for the following year. The Colorado State Fair requires at least 5 exhibitors and not less than 5 animals to be entered and present to conduct a breed show. If for any reason those requirements are not met at the time of show, those animals will be placed in the Other Pure Bred classes. A Breed association that has any debt from the previous Colorado State Fair year will not be allowed to conduct a breed show the current year. The full payment for the previous year must be remunerated in cash directly to the Colorado State Fair accounting department. It is the Colorado State Fair Board of Commissioners decision to reinstate that breed show for the following year.
- 38. PHOTOGRAPHS:** The Colorado State Fair exclusive photographer "Barker Photography" has all rights to photographs. Exhibitor must agree to present their animal(s) at the request of show officials for official photographs. Unofficial (i.e. personal) photographs may not be published without written approval of management. Exhibitors wishing to purchase photographs must contact the Official Photographer (Barker Photography). The official photographer's backdrop cannot be used for personal pictures.

- 39. SIGNS:** A sign may be hung over any animals stalling area addressing the owners name and organization. NO SIGNS which refers in any way to a commercial product, including "For Sale" signs may be placed any where in the Livestock, Sheep/Swine, Goat or Small Animal barns. Brochure distribution of advertisement, are not permitted, such signs and brochures will be confiscated. Management reserves the right to have objectionable signs removed immediately with no dispute from the distributor.
- 40.
