



## JUNIOR LIVESTOCK COMPETITION REQUIREMENTS

**ALL EXHIBITOR AND THEIR FAMILIES ARE REQUIRED TO BE FAMILIAR WITH ALL  
COLORADO STATE FAIR COMPETITION REQUIREMENTS.**

- 1. PREMISES IDENTIFICATION:** All entrants for livestock exhibited in open, breed, or market competitions shall provide a premises identification number at the time of entry. Pursuant to 8 CCR 1208-1 8.4(a)(i)
- 2. COOPERATION:** All exhibitors and their associates are asked to cooperate with all Colorado State Fair officials including office clerks, ground admission, and security and parking personnel in all matters of policy. All entries made in this department are subject to the Colorado State Fair General Competition requirements, General Livestock Competition Requirements and Regulations, Junior Livestock Competition requirements and Regulations, Junior Market Sale Competition requirements, and respective Division Competition requirements. National Show Ring Code of Ethics will govern. All must comply with the respective Livestock Health Requirements. **See individual Junior Breeding and Market Show classes for specific and/or special competition requirements and regulations.**
- 3. FEED AND BEDDING:** There will be no outside bedding allowed on the State Fairgrounds. The Colorado State Fair Management is making it mandatory for all exhibitors to purchase their animal bedding through the Colorado State Fair Feed/Bedding Concessionaire. If you choose to violate this competition requirement and bring your own bedding, you will be asked to remove it from the grounds immediately! This competition requirement will be highly enforced by the Colorado State Fair Management team. First bedding will not be provided for any animals.

Straw or shavings may be used for bedding. Sand is not permitted. Exhibitors are restricted to bringing in only small quantities of special feed only. Price lists will be posted at the feed barn and all feed must be paid for at the time of delivery with cash, checks, money orders, or any major credit cards.

4. **JUNIOR MARKET ANIMAL ENTRIES: Colorado residents only.** Jr. Exhibitors must be bona fide members of a Colorado 4-H Club or FFA Chapter and must be enrolled and active in the project they are exhibiting, and the animal is owned and has been in the continuous possession of the participant; and has met all county requirements. Any market animal that has been sold at a county sale, district sale or premium sale after the specified ownership date (Market Beef - April 1; Market lamb, hog and goats – June 1) are not eligible for competition at the current year Colorado State Fair Junior Livestock sale. That sale is considered consummated when the animal is sold at auction, regardless of disposition of payment or delivery of the animal. 4-H exhibitors must be 8 years of age, and have not reached their 19<sup>th</sup> birthday as of January 1, of the current year to compete. FFA exhibitors must be enrolled and active in an approved Vocational Agriculture High School program and not to have reached their 19<sup>th</sup> birthday as of January 1, of the current year. The County Extension Agent must sign for 4-H entries and the Vocational Agriculture Instructor must sign FFA entries. The exhibitor and a parent/guardian signature is required to certify that the entry is a bona fide enrolled project of the exhibitor's Colorado 4-H or FFA program.

- A. The signature of the 4-H County Extension Agent or FFA Instructor on market entry form is required to confirm: the entry is a bona fide project of their state's 4-H or FFA program and the exhibitor is a member in good standing; that the animal entered is owned and in the continuous possession of the named participant; and has met all county requirements. The 4-H County Extension Agent or FFA Instructor confirms: he has read the General Competition requirements and Regulations, Junior Livestock Competition requirements and Regulations, Junior Market Sale Competition requirements, and special Division Competition requirements and Regulations; has advised participant of these competition requirements for the Colorado State Fair; been cautioned regarding sabotage, tampering, prohibited substance, unethical fitting; and that all competition requirements and regulations have been complied with to the extent of their participation.
- B. The participant and parent/guardian of participant signing entry form(s) certifies that they have read and have been advised of the Colorado State Fair General Competition requirements and Regulations, Junior Livestock Competition requirements and Regulations, Junior Market Sale Competition requirements, and special Division Competition requirements and Regulations. Participant signature certifies they have observed and agree to competition requirements regarding sabotage, tampering, prohibited substance, unethical fitting and agrees to observe and abide all competition requirements and regulations. The parent/guardian must also sign the United States Department of Agriculture Wholesome Meat Act Form at time of market animal weigh-in.
- C. All Junior Market Animal entries (beef, lambs, hogs, and goats) must be accompanied by a completed and signed Packers Certificate and COOL form (one per animal) and a completed and signed International Code of Ethics form (one per exhibitor).


**5. JUNIOR BREEDING ANIMAL ENTRIES: Colorado residency is not required,** unless otherwise stated in individual divisions. Exhibitors must be enrolled and active in 4-H, being 8 years of age and not have reached their 19th birthday as of January 1, of the current year to compete. FFA exhibitors must be enrolled and active in an approved Vocational Agriculture High School Program as of January 1, of the current year and not to have reached their 19<sup>th</sup> birthday as of January 1, of the current year or a member of a Junior Breed Association and who have not reached their 21<sup>st</sup> birthday as of January 1, of the current year. Junior Breed association members must verify membership and age. 4-H and FFA exhibitors must be enrolled in the project in which they are exhibiting and a member in good standing. The Extension Agent must sign 4-H entry forms and the Vocational Agriculture Instructor must sign FFA entries and a parent/guardian signature is required, these signatures certify that the entry is a bona fide enrolled project of the exhibitor's 4-H or FFA program. Exhibitors who are not 4-H or FFA members must provide verification of Junior Association Membership (such as photocopy of current membership card, certificate, or a written verification on entry card from the Junior Breed Association). The Breed Association must verify membership and age.

**A.** The signature of the 4-H County Extension Agent or FFA Instructor on junior breeding entry form is required to confirm that the entry is a bona fide project of their state's 4-H or FFA program and is a member in good standing; that the animal entered is owned and in the continuous possession of the named participant; and has met all county requirements. The 4-H County Extension Agent or FFA Instructor confirms: he has read the General Competition requirements and Regulations, Junior Livestock Competition requirements and Regulations, and special Division Competition requirements and Regulations; has advised participant of these competition requirements of the Colorado State Fair; been cautioned regarding sabotage, tampering, prohibited substance, unethical fitting; and that all competition requirements and regulations have been complied with to the extent of their participation.

**B.** The participant and parent/guardian of participant signing entry form(s) certifies that they have read and been advised of the Colorado State Fair General Competition requirements and Regulations, Junior Livestock Competition requirements and Regulations, and special Division Competition requirements and Regulations. Participant signature certifies they have observed and agree to competition requirements regarding sabotage, tampering, prohibited substance, unethical fitting and agrees to observe and abide all competition requirements and regulations.

**6. OWNERSHIP:** Exhibitors in this department must have owned and personally cared for their livestock and not changed ownership or be transferred from one program to another, on or after the following current year date:

- A. Jr. Breeding Show Animals (all species).....July 20, of current year**
- B. Market Beef: .....April 1, of current year**
- C. Market Lambs, Hogs, and Goats: .....June 1, of current year**

7. **REGISTERED ANIMALS:** All registered animals must be registered solely in the name of the junior exhibitor. No junior animal that is owned in any type of partnership is allowed to show in the junior livestock division (except FFA and CCI special project heifers). Females shown in this department may be registered or grade animals unless otherwise specified. All male animals must be registered in the respective breed association.
8. **OWNERSHIP:** A valid Brand inspection or a notarized bill of sale is required on all Market Beef dated prior to April 1, of current year. An ownership certificate is required on all recorded grade animals shown. A bill of sale or certification of ownership is required on all grade ewes and does shown as of July 20 current year.
9. **ENTRIES:**  Market animal exhibitors may enter as many animals as they have previously nominated, HOWEVER, only 4 animals are allowed to be shown in any Market division. Payment for only 4 animals must accompany entries. The exhibitor must notify the Colorado State Fair office which animals will not be shown by the cancellation date of Aug 18<sup>th</sup>. If the animals you are NOT showing are NOT cancelled by Aug 18<sup>th</sup>, the exhibitor will be charged the initial entry fee for those animals. All Junior exhibitors will be given one (1) complimentary youth exhibitors 5 day pass with proper entry. For an acceptable Livestock entry the following forms are required: **W-9 Form** with exhibitor's **Social Security number and signature**, one (1) completed **Exhibitor' entry summary sheet** for each exhibitor, one (1) completed **entry form** for each animal entry, completed **IAFE** form per exhibitor. All Market entries must have a completed **Packers Certificate** and a **COOL form** (1 for each market animal). All **market hog entries require the Tyson Fair Swine Affidavit (refer to # 6 in the market hog section)**. **Entries will not be accepted with out payment in full.** Check your individual division for any special additional documents your division requires such as copies of **Registration Papers, Brand Inspections**, or a **Bill of Sale**. Pursuant to 8 CCR 1208-1 8.4(a)(i), all entrants for livestock exhibited in open, breed, or market competitions shall provide a **premises identification number**. Without any of the above-mentioned information and forms your entry will be considered incomplete and returned unacceptable. Receipt of entries made by exhibitors in the Livestock office of the Colorado State Fair will be deemed as exhibitor acceptance of all Competition Requirements. See the Livestock Entry Check List on the website.
10. **CANCELLATIONS / REFUNDS:** All cancellations must be submitted (telephone, email or mail) no later than Wednesday August 18<sup>th</sup>. No entry fee refunds will be given for any cancellations made at time of check in. Entry fee refunds may be allowed in the case of a personal emergency for which an official letterhead statement from the licensed practitioner must be submitted or in case of a death in the family, the article from the funeral home must be submitted and in the case of animal sickness a Veterinarian letterhead release is required. All letters must be submitted to the Colorado State Fair Livestock Manager to obtain any type of entry refund. **Parking passes, exhibitor passes and processing fees are not refundable.**
11. **ERRONEOUS ENTRY:** Participants are responsible for their own errors and those of their agents in preparation of entries. Receipt of entries made by exhibitors in the offices of the Colorado State Fair shall be deemed as exhibitor acceptance of all competition requirements, both special and general pertaining to the entry.

- 12. POSSESSION, CARE AND SHOWING:** Exhibitors must accompany their livestock to the show, care for and exhibit animal(s). Only the exhibitor is allowed in the Colorado State Fair show ring during official judging. NO family members are allowed in beef, goat, hog or lamb holding or staging pens at any time. Exhibitors only will be allowed to handle their animal in the official photo area. In case of sickness of the exhibitor or other emergency, an animal may be shown by a substitute exhibitor, provided the substitute is a bona fide 4-H, FFA or Junior Breed Association Member and that exhibitor has been granted permission from the Department Manager. If an exhibitor named on the nomination card does not exhibit his/her animal and did not receive permission from the Department Manager, that exhibitor and animal will be disqualified from the show, forfeiting all awards and premium money.
- 13. UNETHICALLY FITTED LIVESTOCK:** The following are termed unethical practices: doctoring, doping, tubing or injecting show animals for body "fill-ins" or the alteration, changing, defacing or any modification of the markings of show animals and the anatomical structure of an animal, the removal, alteration, changing or purposely damaging ear tags; any type of injection where oils, glycerin or like substances are used for body "fill-in", external applications of such things as liniments and blistering agents that would cause an edematous condition; use of ice packs or other refrigerants to alter the quality of the finish of an animal. Icing of animals will not be allowed. No drench guns or artificial devise for hydrating or feeding of animals will be allowed. Drenching will be allowed only by the Colorado State Fair on call Veterinarian. No animal shall be decorated with any unnecessary trappings, etc., during the judging. Changing the color of hair at any point, spot or area on the animals' body or any grooming material that allows color to be rubbed off from any animal will result in disqualification. No altering structure of hair or wool coat except for trimming and blocking will be allowed. No clipping or hoof treatments are allowed in the Market Hog division. Clipping of hogs with power clippers is prohibited on the fairgrounds. Any entry adding an artificial tail head or tail fin, artificial poll, or adding any hair or hair-like substance will be disqualified. (Open Breed Association Rules supersede). The showing of livestock of any ineligible age or showing of unethically fitted livestock is prohibited. Any exhibitor not complying with any of the above listed unethical practices, or any other practice deemed unethical by the Colorado State Fair Management will forfeit all premium monies and the owner of the animal will be barred from future participation until such time as reinstatement is made by the Fair Management. Refer to individual divisions.
- 14. FITTING OF ANIMAL:** All junior exhibitors named as owner will accept and acknowledge responsibility for the custody, care and feeding of their animal(s). Junior exhibitors are expected to have prepared their own project animal for exhibition. While on the Colorado State Fairgrounds, it is expected that animals exhibited in any junior show must be handled, fitted, dressed, washed, groomed and shown for show competition by the junior exhibitor. If, for safety reasons, a junior exhibitor would need help, he/she shall contact the Colorado State Fair livestock management or General Livestock superintendent to obtain permission for assistance. Assistance may only be provided by immediate family members (father, mother, stepfather, stepmother, sister, brother, grandparents or legal guardian of exhibitor – this does not include hired family employees). The Colorado State Fair superintendent must observe the assistance provided and the junior exhibitor/owner must be present when family member(s) and superintendent(s) are aiding with the exhibitor's animal. Family members can also help with tasks such as verbal support, leading animals, feed and watering. Only the junior exhibitor with the animal is allowed in the show ring and photo area. Junior exhibitors are encouraged to provide support for young exhibitors. Anyone found in violation of this competition requirement will be subject to immediate disqualification without recourse.

**15. SPECIAL MARKET HOG INFORMATION:** Each Colorado State Fair market hog exhibitor must have passed and obtained a **PQA-PLUS** youth certificate through their county. Every Market Hog exhibitor must attach a copy of their PQA-PLUS to their Market Hog Colorado State Fair entry form. The Colorado State Fair Market hog show is terminal; therefore all Market Hog exhibitors must fill out a **fair swine affidavit** prepared by the National Pork Board and the **Premise Identification and individual animal treatment record** a requirement from Tyson CO and these forms are included in the Market Hog section of the premium book. Additional forms will be available on our Colorado State Fair website under forms, in all extension office's or by request from the Colorado State Fair livestock office. All participants must adhere to the fair swine affidavit completed and signed at the time of entry. The fair representatives will provide this form at the time of transportation to the slaughter facility

**16. CLASS ELIGIBILITY:** All Market animal entries must have a nomination card on file in the Colorado State Fair Livestock office to be eligible to show. No market entry will be accepted if a nomination is not on file. Market animals are not eligible for entry in any breeding show. In all showmanship classes exhibitors must show their own animal. The superintendent will determine the number of animals in all classes.

**17. GENERATORS / FANS / BLOCKING CHUTES / TRIM CHUTES / TRIM TABLES:** There will be a **\$25.00** charge for ALL generators payable on your summary sheet or added on at the time of check-in. Generators must be approved by a CSF official superintendent and then a certified CSF tag will be assigned after payment is made. Any generator not having a CSF tag will be removed from the premises. Fans, blocking chutes, generators, trimming chutes and trim tables are restricted to the individual exhibitor's assigned stalling area (not to interfere with any stalling or aisle ways), otherwise an alternate location will be designated by the CSF management. Free standing fans will not be allowed. Hanging fans will only be allowed when attached to the tie rails or to supports attached to the tie rails. No fans will be allowed to blow from behind an animal regardless of attachment or location. All fans must be hung above stalling area. All extension cords must be UL approved minimum 16.3. Over sized and refrigerated free standing fans will not be allowed. The Colorado State fair superintendents have the authority to disallow any unethical equipment. Anyone violating the set up of fans, blocking chutes, generators, trimming chutes and trim tables are subject to a **\$50.00** fine and / or immediate disqualification. No outside scales will be allowed in the market lamb, market hog or market goat barns. Those scales will be provided by the Colorado State Fair. Market beef and open beef will be limited to blocking chute scales only.

**18. STALLS, TACK STALLS, PENS AND TIE OUTS:** All tack stalls requests must be submitted in writing and received in the Livestock Office no later than entry deadline. There is no guarantee the request can or will be honored. The Colorado State Fair superintendents will allow 4 foot (4') beef stall space and a pre-set pen for lamb, goats, and hogs within the barns at the time entry fees are completely paid. Participants will only receive one (1) stall / pen for every animal delivered to the Colorado State Fair regardless of the number of entries made for the show. A cow-calf pair is considered as one (1) entry. A limited number of tie-out stalls are available and will be available on a first come first serve basis. Tampering with other exhibitors stall, pen and/or tie out assignments, any misuse of stalls and aisle way will result in immediate dismissal. Straw bedding purchased from the Colorado State Fair Feed and Bedding Concessionaire may be used in the cattle tie-out areas. Exhibitors must coordinate with the CSF superintendent on duty for tie-out schedules. All stalls and tie-outs must be cleaned daily before 8:30 a.m. Colorado State Fair is not responsible for any animals in the tie-out area at any time day or night.

- 19. BARN SECURITY / RESTRICTED AREA:** For security reasons, all market hog, market lambs, market goat and market beef barns will be locked at 10:00 p.m. every night prior to sale date, 11:00 p.m. for those species that are being judged by permitted livestock judging teams to practice and remain locked until 6:00 a.m. the following morning. Each barn will have Colorado State Fair Public Safety Officers. Exhibitors must confine their animals within their designated stall or pen assignment and wash rack not to wander in general public areas.
- 20. WATER:** A water container, with water, must be visible and available for watering on a regular basis in each penned/stalled area at all times. NO feeding or watering of livestock in show rings, holding pens or to and from re-weigh stations will be permitted. Colorado State Fair Officials reserve the right, at its discretion to contact a CSF veterinarian to determine if water should be given.
- 21. WEIGHING:** Market Beef, Lambs, Hogs and Goats will be weighed under the supervision of the Department of Agriculture weight of scale superintendent of Measurement standards. This will be the official weight. Re-weighs during weigh-ins are not permitted. The Colorado State Fair reserves the right to re-weigh any and all Market Beef, Market Lambs, Market Hogs, and Market Goats immediately following exhibition in the show ring. Beef, Lambs, Hogs, and Goats that deviate more than 5 percent (5%) from their official weight will be immediately disqualified, that animal will be marked appropriately.
- 22. OBJECTIONABLE EXHIBITS:** The Colorado State Fair Management reserves the right to exclude from the grounds, any exhibit, animal, or entry that may be falsely entered, those deemed undesirable or objectionable, without assigning a reason there for. Person or persons, who shall violate any of the competition requirements herein, forfeit all prepaid fees, buy back and show premiums, to include sale premiums.
- 23. PARTICIPANT WARRANTIES OF SALE / BUY BACK ANIMALS:** All qualified sale participants warrants: (a) that the carcass of animal comply with the United States Department of Agriculture Wholesome Meat Act and is fit for human consumption and (b) that the carcass of such animal contain no trace or residue of any illegal drug or any other substance not approved for administration to such animal under applicable laws or Colorado State Fair competition requirements and regulations; and (c) that the carcass of such animal reveals no evidence of any unethical fitting practice, as defined in the Colorado State Fair competition requirements and regulations; and (d) that there exists no unusual circumstances or condition of the carcass of such animal that would materially diminish the value of such carcass. A copy of the exhibitor's packers certificate and the COOL form accompany each animal to slaughter.
- 24. INTERPRETATION AND/OR ADMINISTRATION OF COMPETITION REQUIREMENTS AND REGULATIONS:** The Colorado State Fair reserves to itself the final and absolute right to interpret these competition requirements and regulations and to fairly and impartially settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incident to the Show, and the right to amend or add to these competition requirements and regulations as its judgments may determine. The Colorado State Fair reserves the right to cancel events or change scheduling if deemed necessary. Specific or special competition requirements and regulations or conditions are published in each division where necessary.

**25. ERRONEOUS ENTRY:** Participants are responsible for their own errors, and those of their agents and representatives, in preparation of entries. Entry forms must be completely filled out in accordance with instructions and signed by appropriate parties. By submitting application for entry, participant acknowledges they have read the Colorado State Fair Show agreement of responsibility and liability, Colorado State Fair General Competition Requirements; Open and Junior Livestock Show Competition Requirements; Junior Livestock Sale Competition Requirements; specific and/or special division Competition Requirements and regulations; The National Show Ring Code of Ethics and the USDA Wholesome Meat Act, and agree to observe and abide by these Competition Requirements and regulations. Copies of the IAFE National Show Ring Code of Ethics, the USDA Wholesome Meat Act, Judges Requirements for judging, State Fair Authority rules and all above mentioned Colorado State Fair competition requirements are available in the Livestock office of the Colorado State Fair.

**26. INTERFERENCE:** No person shall act as a judge in any department in which he may have any interest with an exhibitor, agent or employee of an exhibitor, and if such case shall be presented, the Department Supervisor may remove such judge, or substitute another judge temporarily.

**27. TESTING AND FEES:** The Colorado State Fair Management reserves the right to administer random testing, to include DNA, Retinal scanning, for any foreign substances on any animal at anytime while that animal is on the Colorado State Fair premises. All Grand, Reserve Grand and Division Champion animals of each species in the Market divisions will be tested and identification coordinated with the original nomination card. Charges for all testing will be deducted from premiums acquired. The Colorado State Fair will deduct from proceeds as required pertaining to slaughter by state regulations such as, but not limited to: Colorado Beef Board, Colorado Pork Producers tax, Colorado Brand Board, Lamb tax, freight charges, etc.



**28. ANIMALS USED IN JUDGING CONTESTS:** When an exhibitor is called upon to furnish one or more animals for the students to judge in the Dairy or Livestock Judging Contests, he/she is expected to do so. Refusing an animal to be used in this manner will result in disciplinary action by the Colorado State Fair.

**29. ANIMAL CARCASS:** Colorado State Fair reserves the right, at its discretion, to take immediate control and possession of carcass and determine method of disposal.

**30. MARKET ANIMAL DISPOSITION:** The Colorado State Fair strives to insure a fair price for market animal projects. Buy-back bid prices are subject to the highest local quote from qualified slaughter facilities and daily yellow sheet. The Colorado State Fair is not liable for any individual sales conducted through a private party.



**31. PROCEDURES FOR SELECTION OF SALE QUALIFIERS:** Junior Livestock Sale qualifiers will be approved and final decisions will be under the direction of the Colorado State Fair Sale Advisory Committee. The Advisory Committee consists of members from the Colorado State Fair Board of Commissioners, official general superintendents, an official species superintendent and livestock manager. The Junior Livestock Sale selection process is as follows:

1. Grand Champion
2. Reserve Grand Champion
3. Weight or Breed Division Champions in order of showing
4. Weight or Breed Division Reserve Champions in order of showing
5. Continue going through the highest placing in order of showing
6. In the Market Beef show, a similar % of the heifer classes would sell
7. In the event that all equivalent placing within the species can not make sale, the eligible participant names will be put into a drawing and will be selected at random until the maximum numbers are reached.
8. A tentative sale list will be posted immediately after each Grand Champion drive, listing the maximum allowed sale number for that species (40-Beef, 40-Hogs, 40-Lambs, 18 Goats, 2-Pens of Rabbits and 2-Pens of Chickens.) No alternates will be posted
9. Those animals posted will be in the sale. No animal posted will be allowed to leave the Colorado State Fair premises, except by movement directly to slaughter after the sale.

**32. JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SALE PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS INFRACTION:** All animals that made sale will be ultra sounded on Monday prior to sale. Junior Market exhibitors who qualify for the sale will be responsible for the care, control, and custody and feeding of their animals until loaded for slaughter.

**33. OBLIGATION TO SALE:** Any exhibitor qualifying for the Junior Livestock Sale who does not complete his/her obligation for the sale of his/her animal will automatically forfeit all awards, premiums and buy-back money earned at the Colorado State Fair. The exhibitor shall be barred from showing any type of exhibit on the grounds at the Colorado State Fair for a period of three (3) years. The Colorado State Fair is entitled to report any and all competition requirement infractions to the North American Livestock Show and Rodeo Managers Association. Refer to the entry form you signed with the following statement:

**I understand and agree that any and all livestock listed above that are otherwise eligible and that qualify for sale during the Junior Livestock Competition shall sell in the Junior Livestock Sale. I also understand and agree that no livestock that so qualifies and that is otherwise eligible for sale shall be removed from the Fair's grounds except by movement directly to slaughter at the termination of the Junior Livestock Sale. I further understand and agree that the exhibitor listed above shall show any entered livestock that so qualifies as set forth in the Junior Livestock Competition Requirements and Junior Livestock Sale Participation Requirements.**

**34. SHOW RING AND SALE GROOMING:** All Junior Livestock Sale animals must be groomed with accepted grooming practices only prior to entering the sale ring. NO ARTIFICIAL DECORATIONS, including, lettering, paint or glitter of any type will be permitted on any animal entering the show or sale ring. Show awards won are allowed at the Junior Livestock Sale ring. Violators of this competition requirement will not be permitted to continue in the show or Livestock Sale.

**35. QUALIFIERS FOR JUNIOR MARKET SALE:** See individual section for Junior Livestock Sale competition requirements.

**33. OFFICIALS:** The officials of the Colorado State Fair will abide by the following competition requirements and division competition requirements in all decisions affecting the all beef cattle, dairy cattle, goats, sheep, swine and divisions for junior, open and market livestock shows and junior livestock sale.
