**The following competition & entry requirements are general in nature and apply to all General Entry Departments.
Refer to specific Department and/or Special Contest for special requirements.**

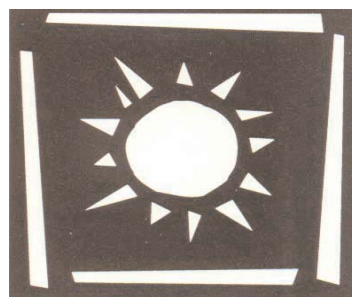
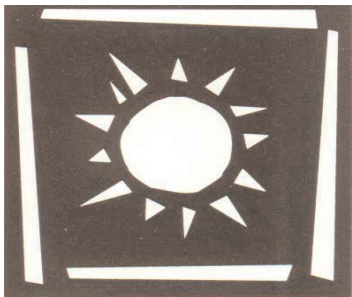
1. Competition is open to the world except where otherwise specified.
2. Entry forms may be photocopied.
3. Only (1) one entry per class unless otherwise specified. You cannot compete with yourself.
4. All entries must be made on regulation forms properly filled out and accompanied by all entry fees. Use Department specific entry form, i.e. Pantry, Needle Arts, Quilts, Special Contests.
5. Entry forms will be accepted from 8AM - 5PM weekdays beginning Monday, June 1, 2009 and will continue being accepted until all contests have been held.
6. **NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED!**
7. Refer to individual Departments and or Special Contests for specific entry and exhibit information.

THINK BEFORE ENTERING OR PURCHASING EXHIBITOR PASSES!!

8. All entry fees and payments for passes must accompany entry forms.
ENTRY FEES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE!!
9. Exhibitor passes purchased at time of entering will be issued to the exhibitor upon **RECEIVING** their entries.
EXHIBITOR PASSES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE!!
10. All returned or insufficient fund checks will be subject to a \$20.00 fee. No premium check will be released to exhibitor until account is paid in full.
11. Most all entry forms are due Friday, August 7, 2009. But there are exceptions! Exceptions to the August 7th deadline are Special Contests, Flower Arrangements, Cut Flowers, Dahlias, FFA Ag Mechanics, Horticulture, Field Crops and Hay.
12. Entry items are received on different dates at different times. **DO NOT MISS RECEIVING DEADLINES.**
REMEMBER!..... if you don't bring your entry item you don't get your Exhibitor Pass!
13. **ALL IMPORTANT CATEGORY DATES & TIMES APPEAR ON THE 1ST PAGE OF EACH DEPARTMENT. PLEASE MAKE NOTE OF THEM!**
14. Entry items that have been previously awarded premiums are not allowed for competition in a succeeding year, (plants excluded). Entry items must have been completed in the same year as entered except where noted.
15. All entry items entered for competition **MUST BE** entered in the name of the person that made the item. **INDIVIDUALS ONLY** must make all entries unless stated otherwise.

16. **ONLY AWARD WINNERS** will be displayed.
17. "For Sale" signs are not permitted.
18. Exhibits may not be removed prior to **RELEASE DAY**. Exhibitors may pick up their entry items **WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 9, 2009, 10AM-6PM in the Creative Arts Building**. For the protection of the exhibitor **CLAIM CHECKS ARE REQUIRED FOR RELEASE OF ALL ITEMS**.
19. **Premium checks will not be issued RELEASE DAY. Premium checks will be mailed to exhibitors after Fair before Friday, October 2, 2009.**
20. The Colorado State Fair Management will use diligence to insure safety of exhibits after arrival and placement but in no case will the Colorado State Fair be responsible for any loss, damage, or injury of any character to any property while on the fairgrounds or at any time or place, nor be liable for or make any payment for the value thereof. Presentation of entry form by the exhibitor shall be deemed acceptance of all competition guidelines and the exhibitor thereby indemnifies the Colorado State Fair from any and all legal proceedings in regards thereto.
21. The Colorado State Fair Management assumes no responsibility for errors in entry. The Colorado State Fair Management shall reserve the right to cancel any Department or Class in which, in its judgment, the entries are insufficient to secure adequate competition.
22. The Colorado State Fair Management may remove any entry, which has been entered in violation of the competition and entry requirements..
23. The Colorado State Fair believes that open judging is essential to encourage individuals to improve their skills and the public is invited to attend judging sessions. Any disruptive behavior on the part of the audience will automatically disqualify the exhibit. Silence during judging is essential.
24. **THE DECISION OF JUDGES SHALL BE FINAL, WITH NO APPEAL CONSIDERED.**
25. Entry items entered for competition in the General Entry Department do not need to have been previously entered in a County Fair.
26. Entry items may be shipped to the Fairgrounds by Parcel Post, UPS or other means providing they arrive by 5PM on Friday, August 7, 2009. All entry items received must be PREPAID. All entry items will be returned via same transportation if return postage is included with the entry fees.

29. Exhibitors whose premiums total **\$200.00** or more or have entered other areas of the Fair will be required to fill out a W-9 before their premium check will be issued.
30. All premium checks must be cashed by December 31 of the year.
31. As a winner of a Special Contest you must be willing to be interviewed by phone or appear in TV spots.
32. All buildings affiliated with the General Entry Department, Creative Arts, Small Animal and the Fine Arts Pavilion will be open to the public 10AM - 10PM starting Friday, August 28 - Monday, September 7, 2009.

COMPETITION & ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

1. Payments for exhibitor passes must accompany entry forms and fees.
2. All rooted plants must have been in the possession of the owner for at least three (3) months. A saucer must accompany all potted plants.
3. Entries in the cut flowers Division must have been grown by exhibitor or have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least three (3) months. Premiums are awarded based on the condition of the plant not the size and are awarded at the judge's discretion. Judge's decisions are final.
4. Entries will be received in the Creative Arts Building. See specific receiving times. Superintendents will place all entries in position.
5. All material is judged the first day on its condition. However, efforts will be made to replenish the entry if possible.
The superintendents reserve the right to remove an exhibit or any part of an exhibit at any time that its appearance is unsuited for display.
6. Non-placing items will be released immediately following judging of the class and until 5:00pm the same day.
Placing items must remain on display and will be released on Wednesday, September 9, 2009 from 10am to 6pm. NO EARLY RELEASES.
7. All items remaining after Wednesday, September 9, 2009 will become the property of the Colorado State Fair unless prior arrangements are made with the General Entry office.
8. Entries in this department are subject to the General Entry competition and entry requirements.

ARTISTIC ARRANGEMENTS **DIVISION 11301**

Premiums: Classes 1 - 4

1st - 15.00 2nd - 10.00 3rd - 5.00

The exhibitor need not grow flowers that will be used in arrangements. All accessories are used at the exhibitor's risk.

Silk, dried or fresh flowers may be used to create all flower arrangements.

1. **"Birds, Bugs & Barnyard Friends"** - An arrangement incorporating silk, dried or fresh flowers and any other "theme related" items. Be creative and have your arrangement feature birds, bugs or barnyard friends and/or any multiple numbers of each in various combinations. Container used for the arrangement must be part of the "theme related" design.. Arrangement not to exceed 18" diameter and 18" tall. To be viewed from all sides.
2. **Autumn in Colorado** - Arrangement in a vase with silk, dried or fresh COLORADO flowers in fall colors. At least 12" tall but not to exceed 18" diameter. To be viewed from all sides.
3. **Spirit of the Colorado Mountains** - Colorful wild flower arrangement (silk, dried or fresh) incorporating pine, cedar or juniper greenery (silk, dried or fresh). Incorporate rock or rocks. Use any container. Not to exceed 24" tall or wide.
4. **"Happy Hour" Bouquet** - Create an "intoxicating" arrangement incorporating silk, dried or fresh flowers and any other "happy hour" items (lime slices, straws, salt, ribbon, etc.) Container must resemble an oversized drink glass. Arrangement not to exceed 12" diameter and 16" tall.

Colorado State Fair will provide container and container can be picked up when submitting entry. Cutting and conditioning flowers for show: Specimens should be cut in late afternoon or early morning. Cut the stem several inches longer than required with a sharp knife, on a slant for the greatest intake of moisture. Place container of water in cool, dark place free of drafts before bringing to show.

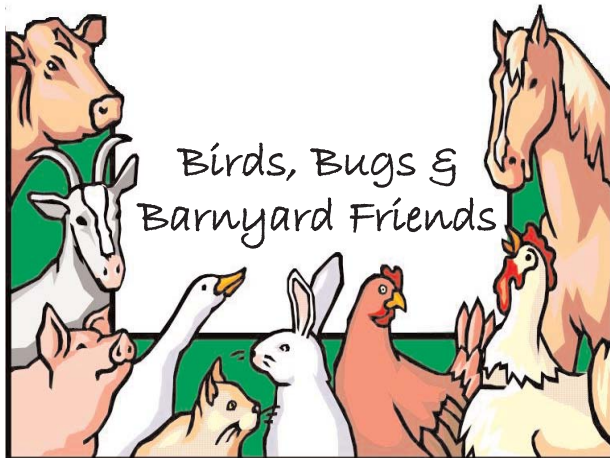

DAHLIA SHOW

NOTICE: All entries must list botanical name.

Dahlias should be de-budded and show pair of true leaves, not spur leaves.

DEFINITIONS:

Large Blooms – All Dahlias, which normally produce flowers that exceed 4” in diameter. Dahlias over 4” in diameter.

Miniatures – All dahlias, which normally produce flowers that do not exceed 4” in diameter. Dahlias smaller than 4” in diameter.

TYPES:

Formal Decorative Dahlias - Ray floret flat, partially involute, or partially involutes. Petals uniform and regularly arranged, tending to recurve toward the stem.

Informal Decorative Dahlias - Ray floret twisted, or curled, or wavy, imparting a petal that is not flat. Petals may be partially involute with their arrangement irregular.

Straight Cactus Dahlias – Ray floret involute for more than one-half their length; pointed, with pronounced curvature of petals toward the center of the flower head.

Semi-Cactus Dahlias - Ray floret broad at base, straight, incurved, or recurved with ray floret involute for up to one half of their length.

Incurved Cactus - Ray floret involute for more than one-half their length; pointed, with pronounced curvature of petals toward the enter of the flower head.

Laciniated - The split or lincination should be in proportion to the ray floret length. There should be an overall twisting in the area of the split involute or involute ray floret, to give an overall fringed effect.

Ball - Full double flowers, ball shaped or slightly flattened at the face, the ray floret blunt, rounded or indented, involute for most of their length, full involute for about one half their length, and normally displayed in a spiral arrangement.

Miniature Ball - Same as BALL Dahlias, differing in size.

Pompon Dahlias - Fully double flowers similar to BALL Dahlias but more globular and smaller in size; the ray floret involute for the whole of their length and fully involute for more than half their length.

Waterlily - Bloom should be fully double and symmetrical, side view should be flat to saucer shaped in arrangement, and the layer of floret should be openly faced to give a delicate appearance. The center should be closed and dome shaped breaking gradually four to seven rows of fully developed outer floret. Outer floret should be broad and slightly cupped. Bloom position preferred 45 degrees.

Peony - Open centered Dahlia with two or more rows of ray floret surrounding the disc flowers. Ray floret adjacent to the disc flowers may be smaller, twisted and/or curled.

Anemone - Dahlias with one or more rows of ray floret surrounding a center of elongated tubular disc floret. The disc floret should be fully developed and present adorned, pincushion appearance.

Collarette - Open centered Dahlia with single row of uniform evenly spaced compound ray floret in a flat plain surrounding the disc flowers. The petaloids surrounding the disc are less than one-half the length of the ray floret.

Single - Open centered Dahlias with a single row of uniform evenly spaced ray floret in a flat plain surrounding the disc flowers.

Mignon Single - Same as SINGLE Dahlia except with the diameter up to two inches.

Orchid - Open centered Dahlias with a single row of uniform evenly spaced ray floret in a flat plain surrounding the disc flowers. The ray floret are involute for two-thirds or more of their length and fully involute for at least one-third their length.

Novelty - Dahlias with characteristics differing from the present classifications. The two kinds of Novelties, one with open centers and the other with closed centers, should be judged against all kinds.
